

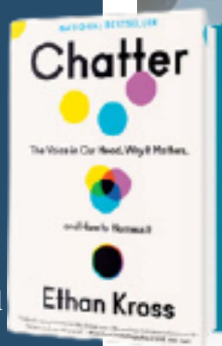

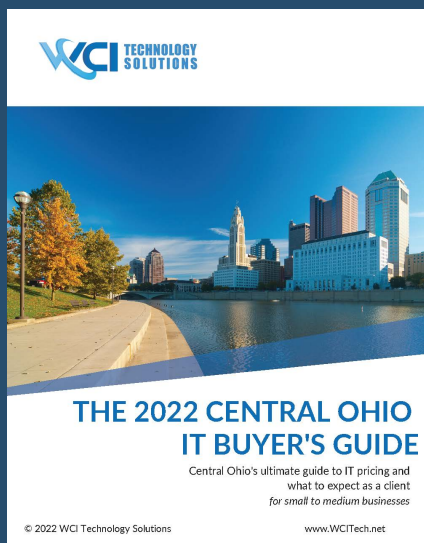
Time and Materials

I would only recommend the time-and-materials approach if you already have an IT team and you need additional support for a problem that your current IT team doesn't have the time or expertise to handle - but even in this circumstance, a co-managed approach would be better and more cost efficient. Under the break-fix model, the IT company has no immediate need to stabilize your network because they are getting paid hourly. The break-fix model is unable to supply ongoing maintenance and monitoring, which computer networks need to stay secure.

Easier editing in SharePoint

Until now, editing in SharePoint page editors has been painful. You had to open the property panel on the right every time you wanted to change something.

But a new update means there's now a floating toolbar above the text. This horizontal bar resizes to match the width of your text web part, and you can access other tools from the three dots drop down menu.

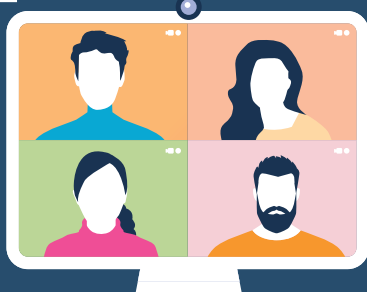

How's your video call etiquette?



Two years on, we're all Video Call Champions now. Bet that's a skill you never thought you'd master!

It's so convenient to hop on a video chat with a colleague to discuss a problem or clear up details on a project. You don't really think twice about it anymore, do you?

Of course you know they exist. But what you might not know is that each time you use your mouse for a minor task, you waste 2 seconds. That might seem like a lot of time to waste, but add it up for every task, every day - and for the average person it becomes 8 days a year!

Here are some universal shortcuts that work on Windows machines and Macs:

- The most obvious: Copy is Ctrl/Command C and Paste is Ctrl/Command V
- Make text size bigger or smaller. Hold down Ctrl/Command and Shift and then press the full stop key to increase the font size by one point. Or the comma key to decrease it one size
- Switch between open programs with Alt/Command + Tab

Many companies put chips in their cartridges to detect toner levels, and sometimes to stop you using fake cartridges.

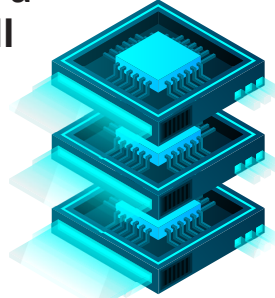
Canon has recently been shipping cartridges without chips. Its put instructions on its website to help you clear error messages on the printer.
